

**Frequently asked questions:**

*What about staples or plastic windowed envelopes in my junk mail?*

No need to remove paper clips, tape, staples, or plastic windows from junk mail, office paper, or catalogs.

*Why only plastic bottles with the neck smaller than the base?*

Bottles are made from a different type of resin than other plastics such as tubs or toys. We do not currently have a market for other types of resins.

*What happens to recyclables?*

Once the bins at the transfer station are full, they are transported to Recycle Works in Clarksville to be sorted and baled before being shipped to facilities that will make them into new plastic or metal containers, new paper, or items such as cellulose insulation, shoelaces, T shirts, and more.

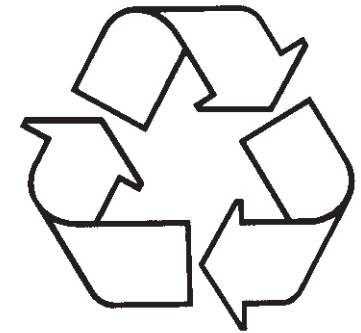

**Curbside Recycling Program**

for  
The City of Waldron

## How does the program work?

Every week, on the same day as your regular trash pick up, city employees will pick up your recyclables using a separate truck and trailer. Set out your bin next to your trash can.

*These bins are the property of the City of Waldron and will need to be returned if you move.*

## What CAN we recycle?

Waldron's curbside program recycles:

- Aluminum Foil and Cans
- Tin / Steel Cans
- Plastic bottles with the neck smaller than the base
- Newspaper
- Magazines and catalogs
- Opened junk mail
- School or Office paper
- Shredded Paper

In addition to the curbside program, additional items, such as cardboard, tires, scrap metal, and household hazardous waste, are accepted for recycling at Waldron's Transfer Station / Recycling Works Drop Off Center.

## How should recyclables be prepared?

- Rinse cans and plastic bottles to avoid unpleasant odors and attracting pests.
- Crushing cans and plastic bottles will make more room in your bin, but is not required.
- Remove caps from plastic bottles.
- Remove samples such as soaps or plastic cards from junk mail.
- Cans and plastic bottles can be placed together into your recycling bin.
- Separate paper to keep it clean and dry.
- Set paper next to or on top of your recycling bin, preferably in a paper bag.



## What if I put something in the bin that doesn't belong?

*Oops!* New programs take time to learn. Items that do not belong in your recycling bin will be left behind with a notice explaining why. For example, a plastic butter tub or a glass bottle will remain in your bin with a notice. Although these items may be recyclable in some programs, Waldron's current program doesn't have markets for these items and is not equipped to handle glass.

## What are some items that are NOT accepted in this program?

- NO Paper towels or bathroom papers
- NO Cereal boxes
- NO Glass
- NO Plastic tubs or toys
- NO Styrofoam

We hope in time to add more items to the list of accepted recyclables.
